EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Co-Presidents: Tricia Anzalone and Judy Frank

- Cash Box request form Please submit this form at least four days prior to your event. I need to get Judy
 or Tricia's signature before I can withdraw money from the account so I'll need enough time to do that. I
 will check the treasurer's folder a couple times a week, but you can also text me to let me know that you
 dropped off a request. My number is 812-8598 and it is on the PTA phone list. I will either put your
 money in the school safe or bring it to you at your event.
- 2. Money Voucher It is very important that two people count the money after your event. Please let me know when you put money in the safe so I can recount and deposit it ASAP.
- 3. Money Voucher checks If you have more than 6 checks, then you will need this sheet to list all of your checks.
- 4. Tax-exempt form This form is not available online, so you have to get a copy from the office. Please remember to use it if you buy anything because we cannot reimburse tax.
- 5. Check request form Fill out this form if you purchased something for the PTA and need to be reimbursed. Don't forget to include your receipt.
